

Canadian Sweethearts – singles and LPs and Lucille Starr - solo

The duo consisted of vocalist Lucille Starr (born Lucille Marie Raymonde Savoie), and her - guitar playing and also singing - husband, Bob Regan. She started her singing career in a British Columbia choir, Les Hirondelles, and then became the female lead with the Keray Regan Band. Eventually she and band member Bob Regan left to tour as Lucille & Bob.

The duo recorded a lot of records in the 50's and 60's before they disbanded in 1977. Regan was born on March 13, 1931 and died on March 5, 1990.

Leon could be on several of the records. The duo also released records as "Lucille and Bob" and as "Bob Regan"
