

Vic Dana - LPs and singles - (born August 26, 1940, Buffalo, New York)



From here and the discography out, it's hard to believe that Leon was involved in session work. But... on several of the later singles the piano sounds like it could be him! The singles are included only to complete the Vic Dana singles discography.
